There is much to report on as the College has been very busy in recent weeks. Therefore, I will summarise key parts of our work and progress in a number of short sections:

PROGRESS IN OUR ACTION PLAN

The College is indebted to Sarah Newall for her leadership of our Post-Ofsted Action Plan, which is fundamental to raising the standards of achievement of all our students. Key actions have included:

- An intensive training programme led by our partner school St Clement Danes, to enhance our understanding of teaching and learning;
- Particular focuses have included subjects within our core curriculum including English, History, Spanish and Business Studies, as well as our management of student's examination data;
- A range of new policies and practices have been reviewed with staff including literacy, numeracy, our quality assurance systems, and marking policy;
- Staff have been observing teaching and learning in a range of schools, to enhance our collective practices in the classroom.

All the above will inform our training week with staff commencing 18th July as well as our Inset Days in 2016-17. There is a lot of support and planning to enhance the learning and progress of our students next year, and I am grateful to all staff for their preparedness to go the extra mile as we work together on our action plan.

TIMES OF THE COLLEGE DAY, 2016-17

We have been reviewing the organisation of the College day and from the start of the new academic year the following changes will apply:

- Teaching will end at 16:00 on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, and at 15:00 on Wednesdays and Fridays. On Wednesdays we have Professional Development Programme for all staff, to continue our work to enhance students' learning;
- 'Registration' will move from the start of the day to the start of the afternoon – so it is important that students are on site and in first lesson for **08:40** every day;
- Lessons will each be fifty minutes. This is so we can facilitate the pace of learning in each lesson. It also means we have more 'lessons' in the timetable i.e. the amount of teaching time is **not** affected.

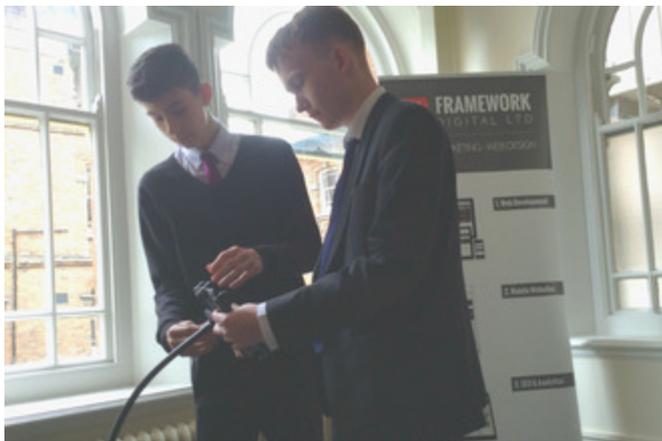


UTC CONFERENCE

COMPUTING STUDENTS HELP PATIENTS RECEIVE REMOTE MEDICAL CARE

Bucks UTC Computing students Will Mathew and Charlie Steer have piloted tele-health care facilities at [South Bucks Hospice](#) to help patients receive aspects of their medical care remotely.

The South Bucks Hospice team was looking for a way to use video communication technology to improve the services they could offer their patients and wanted to set up a pilot project. Digital marketing company, Framework Digital, one of Bucks UTC's partners approached Bucks UTC with this 'real' project opportunity. Students explored video conferencing technology, found an appropriate solution and enabled this onto tablets, so that patients could receive medical advice remotely.'

Jo Woolf, CEO at South Bucks Hospice, commented: 'It is great to have William and Charlie working with us. They exceeded all our expectations, taking the initiative and executing the idea really well. Being able to offer our patients services like physiotherapy and access to medical professionals via a video call is hugely helpful on both sides, speeding up access and supporting independent living.'

SIXTH-FORM STUDENTS BUILD AN ULTRASONIC ROBOT TO EDUCATE YOUNGSTERS AT INTEL'S CODERDOJO

Bucks UTC Sixth-Form Computing students Joshua Cooper, Kieran McClean, Rory Hillyer, Liam Donnelly and Mohammed Khan are building a small robot with ultrasonic sensors to educate and inspire kids with a passion for IT at a local, technology-led club known as CoderDojo.

[CoderDojo](#) is a volunteer-led, community-based programming club for young people, created by Intel. Tech-enthusiasts between 7-17 years of age can learn how to code, develop websites, apps, programmes and games, and explore technology in an informal and creative environment.

To compliment CoderDojo's project portfolio, our students have been building onto a motor and connecting it with an ultrasonic sensor (similar to how a bat detects its surroundings) to drive around Intel's Headquarters and transmit visuals via pulses of sound, to create a map of the building's interior.

Purposely made for the 10-14 year old members of this club, the project aims to educate, excite and open minds about the fantastic range of applications computing can be used for.
