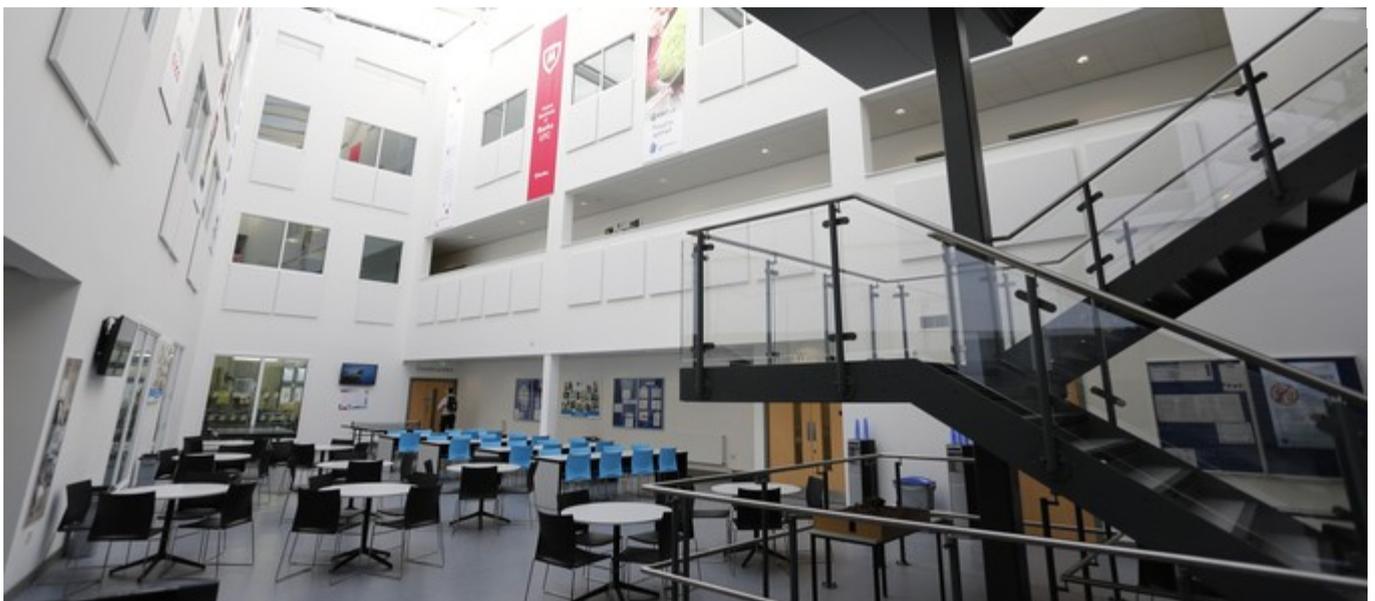

## The College Day for 2017-18

We are in the midst of reviewing our practice(s) in the current year, rationalising what has worked well and where there are aspects we can improve. This monitoring and evaluating process will of course shape our Development Plan for 2017/18 and I welcome any feedback from parents on how and where we can further enhance the day-to-day work in the UTC.

I know that one slight tweak of our day-to-day practice will involve that old chestnut, namely “the times of the day”. It might be helpful if I summarise our current thinking on this:

**8.30am:** Students on site.

**8.40am:** Student briefings/Assembly/Tutorial.

**9-11am:** Two, one-hour lessons.

**11-11.15am:** Break.

**11.15am-1.15pm:** Two, one-hour lessons.

**1.15-2pm:** Lunch.

**2-4pm:** Two, one-hour lessons on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday (College day ends at 4pm).

**2-3pm:** A single, one-hour lesson on Wednesday and Friday (College day ends at 3pm).

So, it is virtually the same arrangement as this year. These times are incorporated into the outlined calendar (below) for 2017-18.
